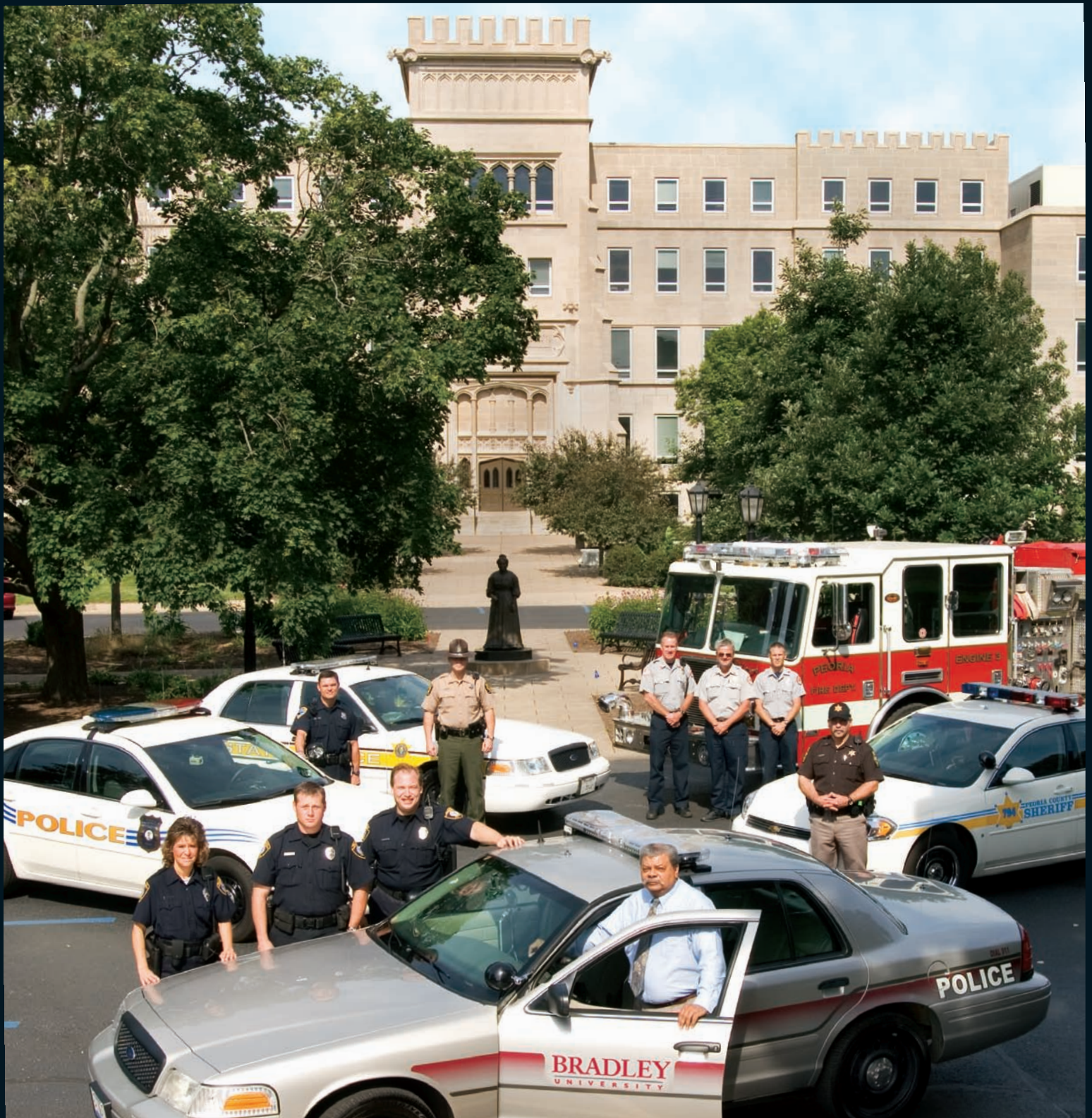

To ensure that we are prepared to do so, we are continually evaluating our emergency communication and response methods and procedures. In the past year, we have added text messaging and public address alerts to our comprehensive emergency communication plan.

The details of our notification plan are in this booklet. We also have provided emergency preparedness and safety information that I encourage you to read and have readily available. It is of utmost importance that each of us takes an active role in emergency preparedness.

Every member of our campus community has a responsibility to make this a safe campus in which to work, learn, study and play. Therefore, please call for assistance if you see something unusual or feel unsafe. Program the Bradley police and emergency numbers into your cell phone.

And I encourage you to read this booklet. Clip out the important telephone numbers and Web site on the back page. Then, put that page somewhere you can easily access it: on a refrigerator, on the door to your room, on a closet door. You may need this information quickly in case of an emergency.

By reviewing this booklet and materials online at <http://emergency.bradley.edu/> you should know what to expect and how to respond in an emergency and how we can work together to maintain a safe and secure campus environment. Let's have an enjoyable and safe school year.

The Bradley Police Department, the Peoria Police Department, and Peoria County Sheriff's Department share jurisdiction and provide services for the Bradley campus community and the BUPD works cooperatively with many other municipal agencies.

# BRADLEY UNIVERSITY POLICE DEPARTMENT

The BUPD officers are commissioned by the state and have full law enforcement power.

They have received training in police work, emergency medical procedures, first aid and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR). Officers conduct foot, bike and vehicular patrols of the campus and residence halls and are on duty 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

Bradley officers have authority to apprehend and arrest anyone involved in illegal acts on or off campus. If the offense is committed by a Bradley student, officers may refer the individual to the Student Judicial System.

The BUPD, the Peoria Police Department, and the Peoria County Sheriff's Department share jurisdiction and provide police services for Bradley-owned on- and off-campus student residences, as well as fraternity and sorority residences. The BUPD also is a part of the Peoria County 911 Emergency System.

## Crime Prevention Services

A common theme of all crime prevention programs is to encourage students and employees to be aware of their responsibility for their own security and the security of others.

BUPD facilitates crime prevention and sexual assault programs for students, parents, faculty and staff, student and community organizations and Residential Living and Leadership resident advisers throughout the year.

### Security Awareness Programs

Students are informed of police services and crime on campus and in surrounding neighborhoods during orientation. Similar information is presented to new employees.

Periodically, the BUPD, in cooperation with others at the university, presents crime prevention sessions on sexual assault (rape and acquaintance rape), theft, vandalism, personal safety and residence hall security.

Information also is disseminated to students and employees through crime prevention awareness packets, security



alert posters, displays, videos, and articles and advertisements in the student newspaper. Pamphlets and videos dealing with personal safety and security are available from the BUPD, Health Services and the Center for Residential Life and Leadership.

### Operation Identification

The BUPD will lend engraving equipment to students, free of charge, to permanently mark their valuables.

### Campus Awareness for Rape Education

C.A.R.E. is a network of students and campus professionals who give educational presentations and referral resources on rape awareness and prevention.

### Rape Defense classes

The BUPD offers Rape Aggression Defense System (R.A.D.) training. It is a comprehensive course that begins with awareness, prevention, risk reduction and avoidance, and progresses to the basics of hands-on defense training.

### Victim Witness Program

The Victim Witness Program provides information, advocacy and support to students, faculty and staff who need assistance in dealing with on- or off-campus traumatic or judicial issues. Literature about the program is available in the offices of Residential Life, Health Services and at the BUPD.

### Criminal Activity Off-Campus

When a Bradley student is involved in an off-campus offense, Bradley police officers may assist with the investigation.

### Counselors

Health Services, including physicians and counselors, encourage students to report crimes on a voluntary basis to the BUPD. Statistics related to sexual assaults will be reported to the Sexual Assault Response Team coordinator who will compile the statistics and relay these to the BUPD.

### Fingerprinting

The BUPD provides fingerprinting services for University students, faculty and staff.

## Other Services

### Campus Emergency Phone System

A number of emergency telephones are strategically placed on campus. (see page 9)

Pushing the red button on the emergency phone will get you to the City of Peoria Enhanced 911 operator. By dialing "0" your call will be answered by a Bradley dispatcher/operator. The system will display your location to either operator. Operators are on duty to receive calls 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. The phones also are equipped with touch-tone pads and can be used for on-campus calling.

### Escort Program

677-2800 • Dusk to Dawn

The Escort Program provides a means for students, faculty and staff to travel safely from place to place within close proximity to campus. Operated by BUPD officers, the program consists of walking or driving individuals to areas within designated boundaries. Escorts are available every evening from dusk until dawn.

### Motorist Assistance

The BUPD provides some motorist assistance for students, faculty, staff and guests. These include charging dead batteries, retrieving keys locked inside a vehicle, and calling tow trucks.

### Lost and Found

The campus Lost and Found is located at the BUPD in the Duryea Avenue parking deck. Lost and found items are stored for ninety days. After ninety days, the items are donated to local charities.

# GENERAL EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

- Familiarize yourself with evacuation procedures for your building. Emergency Evacuation/Tornado Shelter maps are posted on the walls of all buildings.
- Know where fire extinguishers are located in your building.
- Each academic and administrative unit should determine an assembly point outside of its building in the event of a building evacuation.

## Faculty and Administrative Staff Responsibility

When a fire alarm sounds or you are warned that there is a fire, all persons are required under state law to exit the building immediately. Failure to evacuate is a criminal offense. Persons in charge of a facility (including faculty teaching classes) are responsible for evacuating their area, and may be held personally liable for a failure to evacuate.

When a tornado warning siren sounds, persons in charge of a facility are responsible for evacuating persons in their area to a designated severe weather shelter area. Each building has a designated severe weather shelter area.

## Fire

### Immediate action

#### For the person discovering a fire:

Call 911.

Pull the nearest fire alarm.

Extinguish the fire only if you can do so safely and quickly.

If the fire cannot be extinguished, close the doors, alert others, and meet firefighters or BUPD when they arrive.

#### For occupants of the building:

Evacuate the building via the nearest exit. Assist others in exiting the building.

Close the doors to your immediate area.

Do not use elevators.

Avoid smoke-filled areas.

#### For persons evacuating from the immediate fire area:

Feel door from top to bottom. If it is hot, do not proceed; go back.

If door is cool, crouch low and open the door slowly. Close door quickly, if smoke is present.

## Student and Staff Responsibilities

The cooperation and involvement of students and staff in a campus safety program are essential. Students and staff must assume responsibility for their personal safety and the security of their personal belongings by taking simple, common-sense precautions.

- Doors should be locked at night and when a room is unoccupied.
- Valuable items should be marked and a record kept.
- Students and staff with cars must park in assigned areas and keep vehicles locked at all times. Valuables should be locked in the trunk.
- Any suspicious-looking individuals or incidents on campus should be reported to the residential life staff or to campus police.
- Faculty, staff or students who wish to remain anonymous may inform BUPD of criminal activity by notifying the BUPD or the Center for Residential Life and Leadership. Indicate the nature of the crime, the location of the crime, date(s) and time(s) the crime occurred, identities of suspects, and descriptions of any vehicles involved in the crime.

If no smoke is present, exit the building via the nearest stairwell or exit.

If you encounter heavy smoke in a stairwell, go back and try another stairwell.

Do not re-enter a building until the fire department or Bradley Police have given the all-clear message.

### Procedures for persons with physical disabilities:

Persons with physical disabilities are permitted to stay in a building during an emergency situation only if they are non-ambulatory or elevator assistance is essential for their evacuation.

Seek a safe place (preferably a room with an exterior window, a telephone and a solid door).

Call 911 and report their location.

Authorities will provide evacuation assistance and advice.

Persons with a visual impairment should seek assistance from other occupants to help them evacuate.

All other persons with disabilities must evacuate the building in an emergency.

Most academic and administrative buildings are equipped with automatic fire alarm systems. Testing is normally conducted during hours the building is closed. When it is necessary to test during normal working/classroom hours, the building will be posted in advance. Any fire alarm that sounds must be treated as an actual alarm

unless prior notice of testing is given. When evacuating, take your personal belongings with you, and secure your office as you leave.

## Tornado

The University has placed NOWA severe weather radios in many department offices as part of ongoing life safety systems. The radios will alert staff about severe weather. Staff should alert others within their building.

The radios are used in conjunction with the City of Peoria siren warning system. The sirens alert persons outdoors but do not provide good coverage indoors. The sirens are activated for tornado warnings only, not for watches. The City of Peoria will initiate a siren, or steady tone, for 3 to 5 minutes. When you hear the siren, take cover immediately — danger is imminent.

A tornado watch means conditions are right for a tornado. During a tornado watch, staff should be alert to weather conditions. A tornado warning means that a tornado has been sighted.

### Immediate action

Remain calm.

Go to an area of safety. Each building has a designated severe weather shelter area. Rooms and corridors in the innermost part of a building are areas of safety.

Stay clear of windows, or large free-standing expanses.  
Seek shelter in the best location to help minimize exposure to danger.  
DO NOT use elevators during a tornado warning. Persons with mobility concerns should go to an area of safety at the time of a tornado watch; DO NOT wait for a tornado warning.  
Close all doors, including main corridors, making sure they latch.  
Crouch near the floor or under heavy, well-supported objects and cover your head.  
Be alert for fire.

## Earthquake

### Indoor Procedures

Seek protection in a doorway without doors, under a desk or table or in a corner.  
Stay away from glass, windows, shelves, heavy equipment and outside walls.  
Do not use elevators.  
Be prepared for aftershocks.  
Call 911 if emergency help is needed.  
Report physical damage to Facilities Management.  
If a related emergency, such as a fire or gas leak occurs, activate any building alarm.  
When the quake subsides, leave the building.  
Assist persons with disabilities.  
Walk to the nearest exit and ask others to do the same.  
Once outside, watch for falling debris and move to a clear area at least 500 feet away from affected building(s).  
Stay away from power lines, utility poles and trees.  
Keep roadways, fire lanes, hydrants and walkways clear for emergency crews.  
If you are asked and if you wish to do so, assist emergency crews.  
Keep clear of any emergency command posts unless you have official business.  
Do not re-enter an evacuated site unless directed to do so by BUPD.

### Outdoor Procedures

Move away from buildings, trees, and utility poles. Remain at least 500 feet away from such structures.  
Avoid power or utility lines.  
Lie or sit down to avoid being thrown about.

If you are in an automobile, pull over to the side of the road and stop. Avoid power lines, trees, overpasses and masonry or high-rise buildings. Stay in the vehicle for shelter.

## Bomb threats & suspicious packages

### If you receive a bomb threat:

Call 911.  
Write down exactly what was said as soon as possible. If you have a display telephone, note the number from which the call originated.

### If you receive a suspicious package or locate a suspicious item:

Do not move or open the item.  
Clear employees and students away from the immediate area, and lock the area.  
Meet responding police officers outside.

## Active shooter

### If someone has entered a building or area of the campus and begins shooting, the following actions are recommended only if you feel SAFE to leave:

Exit the building or area immediately.  
Notify anyone you encounter and have them exit the building or area immediately.  
If you DO NOT feel it is SAFE to exit the building or area, these actions are recommended:  
Go to the nearest room or office.  
Close and lock the door. If there is no lock, try to barricade the door.  
Cover the door windows.  
Keep quiet.  
DO NOT answer the door.  
Call 911 and provide: your name and location; identification, description and number of shooter(s); number of people involved.  
Wait for emergency personnel to help you out of the building or to give further instructions. Try to remain quiet and out of sight. If you are in a room that has windows to the outside and begin to feel threatened or unsafe, break out the window, clear the broken glass, and exit the room.

## ForeWarn

The purpose of Bradley's emergency notification system, ForeWarn, is to quickly and efficiently convey to the campus community information that may impact personal safety or the ability of personnel to safely and efficiently perform their job responsibilities. The notification system includes text messaging, a telephone hotline (677-4000), email messaging, audio messaging, public address announcements and the University website. The variety of communication tools allows the University to convey urgent information to as many members of the campus community as possible as quickly as possible.

If an event arises on- or off-campus, which in the judgment of the Chief of University Police constitutes an ongoing threat, a campus-wide warning will be issued. The use of emergency text messaging is restricted to life-threatening or potentially life threatening incidents. Students and employees are encouraged to register for emergency text messaging on the Bradley website at <https://mybu.bradley.edu/MyBU>.

In a medical emergency, campus-wide notification will be distributed via email and the website. Information also will be posted in each residence hall and fraternity and sorority house.

## Timely Warning

A Timely Warning Alert is a means to notify students, faculty and staff about crimes that represent a serious threat to the campus, based on the nature of the crime, continuing danger to the campus, and risk of compromising law enforcement efforts. Whenever other police agencies make the BUPD aware of an off-campus crime that represents a threat to the campus, the university will issue a Timely Warning Alert through the department web site at [bradley.edu/police/crime/alerts.shtml](http://bradley.edu/police/crime/alerts.shtml). Information also may be disseminated through the ForeWarn emergency notification system.

## Alcoholic Beverages and Illegal Drugs

### Alcoholic Beverages

The possession, sale or the furnishing of alcohol on the Bradley campus is governed by the Bradley Alcohol Policy, Peoria City Ordinance and Illinois law. The enforcement of alcohol laws on-campus is the primary responsibility of the BUPD.

It is Bradley's policy to expect its students and employees to comply with all local, state and federal laws regarding the use or possession of alcoholic beverages and controlled substances. The State of Illinois requires that persons be 21 years of age or older to purchase, possess or consume alcoholic beverages, including wine and beer. It is unlawful to sell, furnish or provide alcohol to a person under the age of 21. Violators are subject to arrest.

The Bradley campus has been designated "drug free," and only under certain circumstances is the consumption of alcohol permitted. It is a violation of the Bradley Alcohol Policy for anyone to consume or possess alcohol in any public area of campus without prior University approval. Kegs (including cooler balls, etc.) are not permitted in any University-supervised housing, including residence halls, fraternities, sororities and apartments. Violators are subject to University disciplinary action, criminal prosecution, fine and imprisonment. Organizations or groups violating alcohol/substance policies or laws are subject to sanctions by the University.

### Illegal Drugs

Bradley condemns the possession, use, manufacture or distribution of all illegal drugs by anyone in any campus facility. Violators are subject to arrest, imprisonment or fine.

Students who violate University regulations and state law may be subject to disciplinary sanctions as listed in the Student Handbook ([bradley.edu/police/crime](http://bradley.edu/police/crime)). Students may also be subject to disciplinary sanctions for conduct that occurs off campus.



Primary types of unacceptable group or individual behavior are: the non-prescribed possession, trafficking in, use, or serving of amphetamines, barbiturates, cocaine, illegal narcotics, marijuana, hallucinogens, or other controlled substances including "date rape drugs," or use or possession of drug paraphernalia, or the trafficking and serving of substances misrepresented as drugs to other persons.

## Alcohol and Substance Abuse Education

Bradley University recognizes that an academic community is harmed in many ways by the misuse of alcohol and the use of other drugs. Education can be impaired. In addition, serious health problems, strained social interactions and decreased productivity can occur. Bradley promotes an environment that reinforces healthy, responsible living; respect for community laws; campus standards and regulations; the individual's responsibility within the community; and the intellectual, social, spiritual/ethical, emotional and physical well-being of its community members.

### Alcohol Awareness

The university seeks to establish alcohol awareness among students with an emphasis on alcohol education. The university will:

- Promote and encourage the strategic placement of signs, posters and announcements concerning alcohol awareness and alcohol education;
- Conduct educational programs for students throughout the year concerning alcohol awareness and the problems related to alcohol use;
- Encourage all organizations sponsoring an open party to check for a Bradley I.D., which shall be required for admission..

### Alcohol Awareness and Education

In addition, Bradley's Wellness program provides alcohol abuse education through several programs including:

**Fresh Start** - The Fresh Start program is conducted and coordinated by trained student peer leaders. It is a comprehensive, one-on-one alcohol program for students who have been referred by the university's judicial system, residence halls staff, Greek leaders, or health services staff for violation of campus alcohol policy. Fresh

Start encourages students through motivational interviewing techniques to consider behavior change. In addition to encouraging students to drink responsibly, the Fresh Start leader also educates students on how to recognize the signs and symptoms of alcohol poisoning.

**Bradley H.E.A.T.** - Students involved in Bradley H.E.A.T. serve as peer leaders and present information to facilitate behavior changes in Bradley students, area high school and grade school students and community groups. They use interactive and innovative workshops to discuss topics such as sexual health, substance use and abuse, smoking and stress relief/massage.

**SONOR** is a student run marketing, advertising and public relations organization. Its purpose is to promote healthy social norms pertaining to alcohol.

**Marijuana Intervention Program (MIP)** - Students involved in MIP participate in one-on-one peer counseling sessions via the internet.

#### **Addiction Counseling Services**

Bradley students may contact Health Services at 677-2700 for an appointment with a counselor for an assessment for substance abuse.

Counseling Services provides help for students who have a history of alcoholism or drug abuse in a family member.

#### **Bradley Employees**

All employees may initiate a request for university assistance to participate in an approved drug substance abuse assistance or rehabilitation program. Information will be provided concerning 12-step self-help groups both on campus and in the community. In addition employees may obtain substance abuse counseling services through a certified substance abuse counselor by calling Counseling Services.

#### **University Sanctions for Students**

Disciplinary sanctions for violation of university regulations can include dismissal or suspension from the university, disciplinary probation, censure, fines or assessments, referrals, and campus or community assistance. A grievance policy and procedure is in place for appeal by students. Description of the disciplinary sanctions is available in the Student Handbook.



## **Date Rape Drugs**

Date rape drugs are odorless and tasteless and may be used by attackers to sedate their victims.

Individuals and/or organizations suspected of possession, use, administration or sale of sedative drugs, including GHB, rohypnol, ketamine, or other date rape drugs, may be prosecuted under Illinois criminal statutes and subject to university disciplinary sanctions.

## **Sexual Offender Registration**

The Campus Sex Crime Prevention Act of 2000 is a federal law that provides for the tracking of convicted sex offenders enrolled at, or employed by, institutions of higher education. The federal law requires state law enforcement agencies to provide Bradley with a list of registered sex offenders who have indicated that they are either enrolled or employed at Bradley.

An Illinois State Police registration list of sex offenders is maintained and available at the BUPD. In addition, a list of registered sex offenders in Illinois is available from the Illinois State Police at [www.isp.state.il.us/sor/](http://www.isp.state.il.us/sor/).

## **Sexual Assault Prevention and Response**

Bradley educates the student community about sexual assault and date rape through the Center for Residential Living and Leadership, Health Services, Wellness Programs, Campus Awareness for Rape Education (CARE), and

freshman orientation. The BUPD offers sexual assault education and information programs to students and employees through floor meetings and safety programs. The BUPD also offers the Rape Aggression Defense System, a system of self-defense for women.

Bradley will not tolerate sexual assault in any form. If a student has been sexually assaulted, university personnel are advised to use the following procedures:

- Ensure the victim is in a safe and secure environment.
- Encourage the victim to try to preserve all physical evidence.
- Encourage the victim to seek medical treatment.
- Encourage the victim to contact campus police as soon as possible.
- Advise the victim of options for pursuing charges against the offender(s).
- Encourage the victim to talk with a trained counselor. Counselors can be reached at the Center for Residential Living and Leadership, Counseling Services or, the Center for Prevention of Abuse. (see back cover)

At the victim's request, the Executive Director, Center for Residential Leadership and Living, may make special provisions for temporary alternate campus housing during the period of investigation and adjudication. Other special support also can be provided on request.

Incidents of sexual assault, sexual misconduct or acquaintance rape reported to Health Services will be reported to the Sexual Assault Response Team Coordinator and documented for confidential reporting to BUPD. Students charged with sexual assault can be prosecuted under Illinois law. In addition, students can be disciplined under the University Code of Student Conduct and, if found guilty, face the possibility of suspension or dismissal from the university.

University disciplinary proceedings are detailed in the Student Handbook. The hearing procedures provide, in part, that the accused and the victim have the right to be assisted by an advisor of choice.

## Accurate and Prompt Crime and Emergency Reporting

Community members, students, faculty, staff and guests are encouraged to report all crimes and public safety related incidents to the BUPD in a timely manner. To report an emergency on- or off-campus, call 911. To report a non-emergency crime, or public safety-related matter on campus, call BUPD at ext. 2000. Off-campus incidents should be reported to Peoria city or Peoria County police. Dispatchers are available 24 hours a day. All relevant BUPD incident reports are forwarded to the Center for Residential Living and Leadership for review and potential action by the Student Judicial System.

If a sexual assault occurs, services are available for the victim. Bradley has a Sexual Assault Response Team (SART) with trained members available to assist a victim 24 hours a day. (See policy on Sexual Assault, page 5.)



Crimes should be reported to the BUPD to ensure inclusion in the annual crime statistics and to aid in providing timely warning notices to the community.

To report a crime on campus without involving the BUPD, contact one of the “Campus Security Authorities” listed on the back cover. Any faculty, staff or residence hall staff can be informed of a

crime, so personal judgment may be used as to confiding and reporting crimes.

### Confidential Reporting Procedures

If you are the victim of a crime and do not want to pursue action, you may still want to consider making a confidential report. With your permission, the BUPD can file a report on the incident without revealing your identity. A confidential report will keep the matter confidential, while taking steps to ensure your safety and the safety of others. With such information, the University can keep an accurate record of the number of incidents involving students, determine where there is a pattern of crime, and alert the campus community to potential danger. Reports filed in this manner are counted and disclosed in the annual crime statistics for the institution.

## Annual Disclosure of Crime Statistics

The Bradley University Police Department (BUPD) and other key university departments prepared this report to comply with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Crime Statistics Act. Information on the Clery Act is online at [securityoncampus.org](http://securityoncampus.org). This report is prepared in cooperation with the local law enforcement agencies, the Center for Residential Living and Leadership, Counseling Services, Health Services, the Division of Business Affairs, and the Division of Student Affairs.

Campus crime, arrest and referral statistics include those reported to the BUPD, designated campus officials and local law enforcement agencies. These statistics may also include crimes not required to be reported by The Clery Act. Health Services staff and Residential Living and Leadership staff inform their clients of the procedures to report crime to the BUPD on a voluntary or confidential basis. A procedure is in place to gather crime statistics disclosed confidentially.

This report is provided to all enrolled students, faculty and staff. Copies of the report may also be obtained at the BUPD office. All prospective employees may obtain a copy from the Human Resources Office, 239 Sisson Hall.

A daily campus crime log is available at the BUPD.

An abridged version of this published information is available in Braille. Contact the BUPD for more information.

## Crime Statistics for the University Community

Bradley reports crime figures for the most recent five-year period. A crime is reported when a victim or witness brings it to the attention of the BUPD, local police or a university administrator.

Crimes are reported by four geographic locations: a) on campus, b) on-campus residential facilities, c) noncampus buildings or property, and d) public property contiguous to the university. The following criminal offenses are included in the statistics: (I) murder; (II) sex offenses, forcible or nonforcible; (III) robbery; (IV)

aggravated assault; (V) burglary; (VI) motor vehicle theft; (VII) manslaughter; (VIII) arson; and (IX) arrests or persons referred for campus disciplinary action for liquor law violations, drug-related violations, and weapons possession.

Hate crime data is collected and reported according to category of prejudice for crimes in which the victim is intentionally selected because of his or her actual or perceived race, gender, religion, sexual orientation, ethnicity or disability.

The BUPD also reports the following categories of arrests or, if an arrest was not made, referrals for campus disciplinary action: liquor violations, drug abuse violations and weapons possessions.

# CAMPUS AND COMMUNITY



## Campus Buildings: Security and Access

During business hours, Bradley University (excluding certain housing facilities) will be open to students, parents, employees contractors and guests. During non-business hours, access to all university facilities is by key or by admittance via the BUPD or Residential Living and Leadership staff.

Except for residence halls, most university facilities are open to the public during the day and evening hours when classes are in session. Access to classes and programs is restricted to those enrolled in them. When Bradley is closed, university buildings are generally locked. Some Bradley-sponsored programs are open to the general public while others are restricted to students and staff with a valid Bradley ID. All residence halls have limited access, with some halls having all outside doors locked on a 24-hour basis and other halls having only main doors unlocked during daytime hours. The residence hall lobby offices are staffed

during the afternoon and evening. Residence hall student security staff are available from 11 p.m. to 4 a.m. Sunday through Thursday and from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Fridays and Saturdays. During these times, student security staff make regular rounds throughout the buildings, checking to see that outside doors are locked and that floors are quiet.

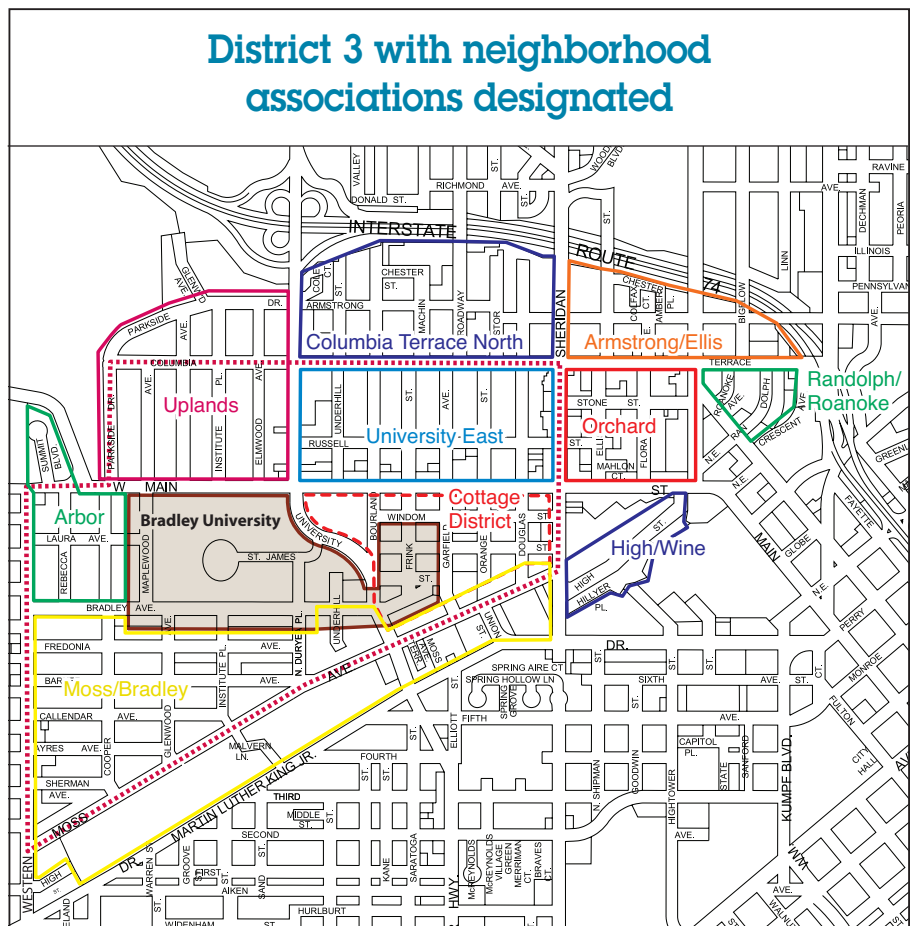
Bradley reserves the right to enter rooms to assure proper maintenance and repair, to provide for the health and safety of residents, or to investigate suspicion of a violation of university regulations or laws.

Over extended breaks, the doors of all halls will be secured 24 hours a day. Some facilities such as Cullom-Davis Library and the Health Center may have individual hours. Only those with prior approval will be admitted to facilities during extended breaks.

St. James Place Apartment Complex provides housing for juniors, seniors and graduate students. All apartment buildings have controlled access. The complex and adjacent Meinen Field have a number of strategically placed emergency phones.

Bradley facilities personnel routinely inspect buildings and grounds. Special attention is given to issues such as lighting, plant growth and debris that may affect personal safety. Facilities management also responds to make repairs to such things as broken windows, lights and locks.

Facilities management maintains a Central Communications Center that operates 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Report any safety or repair problems to the Center at ext. 2915.



*The Bradley campus is located in the historic West Bluff and is part of Peoria Police District 3. The Bradley Police patrol area is designated by the red dotted line.*

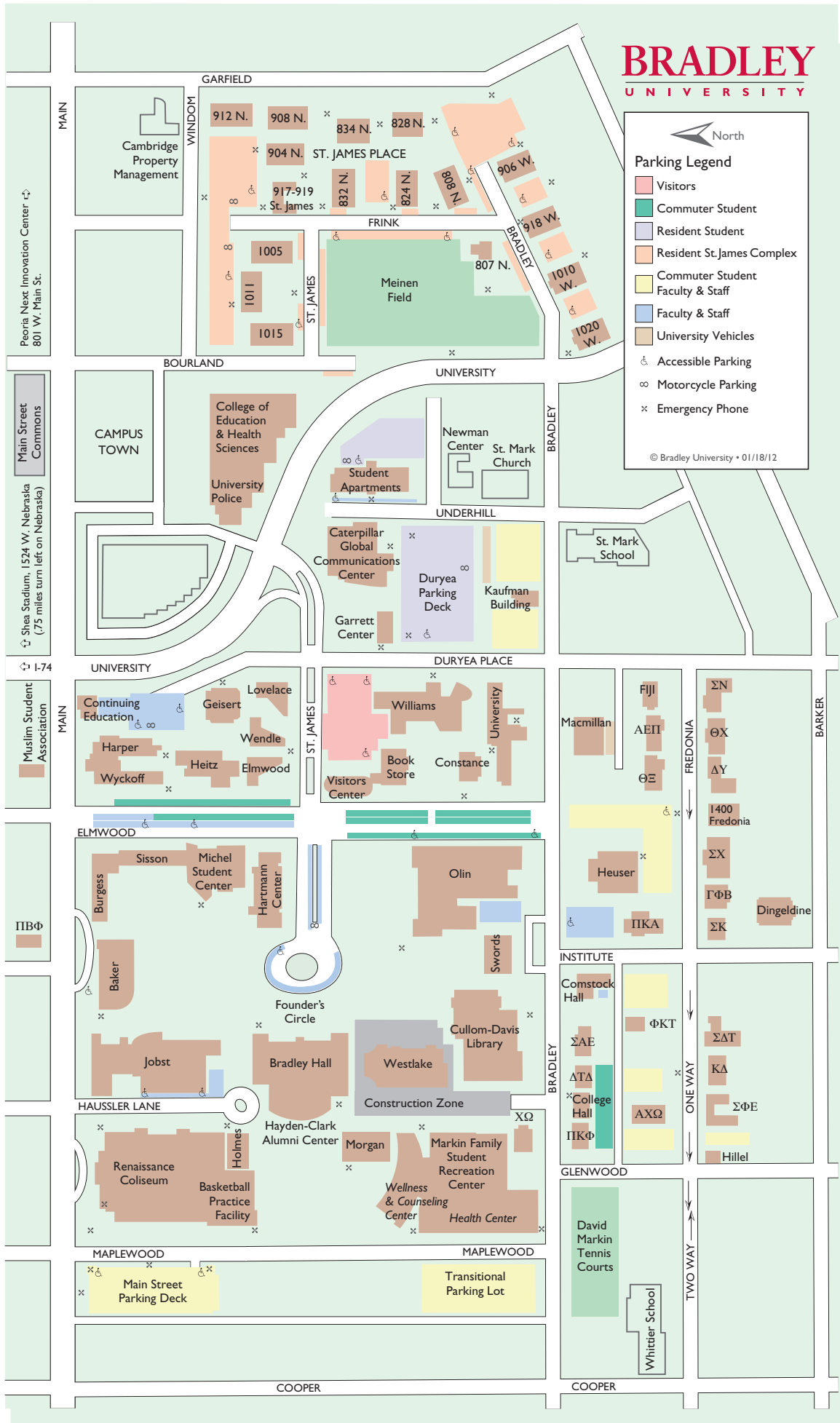
