Professor Fuller to give commencement address

Dr. Robert Fuller, Caterpillar Professor of Religious Studies, will give the commencement address during the mid-year commencement ceremony on December 16. The ceremony will begin at 10 a.m. in Robertson Memorial Field House.

Dr. Fuller was named Caterpillar professor of religious studies in August. Caterpillar Professorships recognize the highest level of scholarship among senior faculty who hold tenure and have the

rank of full professor.

Dr. Fuller is the author of eight books and numerous articles published in professional journals. He is among the top authorities in his field with two of his books being used in university classrooms across the country.

The honorary marshal will be Dr. Kelly McConaughay. The student marshals will be Jennifer Anderson and Kevin Heffern. The standard bearer will be Vanessa Hall.

Dr. Jawanza Kunjufu is King Celebration speaker

The Office of Multicultural Student Services at Bradley will host Dr. Jawanza Kunjufu as the 2001 Dr. Martin Luther



King, Jr. Celebration speaker on January 25 at 6 p.m. in the Michel Student Center ballroom.

The theme for the celebration is "King's Dream: A

Jawanza Kunjufu Work in Progress."

Dr. Kunjufu is a renowned educator and is president of African American Images, a successful Chicago-based communications company. He is a former visiting professor at the United Theological Seminary- Doctoral Division and Executive Director of African American Images Talent Center. He received his B.S. degree from Illinois State University and his doctorate from the Union Graduate School.

Dr. Kunjufu is the author of numerous books including: *Lessons from History: A Celebration of Blackness* (Elementary and Advanced Editions); *To Be Popular or Smart: The Black Peer Group*; *Developing Positive Self-Images*

and Discipline in Black Children; and the best seller *Countering the Conspiracy to Destroy Black Boys*. His books of fiction are entitled *Good Brothers*, *Looking for Good Sisters* and *Sankofa Stories of Power, Hope and Joy*.

Dr. Kunjufu spoke at the historic Million Man March on October 16, 1995. He has been a guest on the Oprah Winfrey Show.

He was the executive producer of a full feature movie about Black family values titled *Up Against the Wall*, starring Marla Gibbs and is an educational consultant to Sesame Street and BET's Teen Summit.
